

As we were wrapping up this evaluation, we received a few of West Marine's new tethers, which are made by Steams and due to be released this spring. Look for a tether test <u>update soon</u>.

What's new? The most notable features of the tethers we examined are the new Kong Tango 715 snap hooks at the boat end and the embedded-flag stress indicators. The aluminum Kong hook weighs 110 grams, less than most stainless hooks. Total weight for the single tether with a Kong hook is about 0.7 pounds, an average weight savings of about 5 ounces when compared to the single tethers tested. The Kong hook

requires a squeeze to open, but manufacturers claim it's easy to open with cold or gloved hands. Satisfying ISAF recommendation 5.02.3, the new products have colored flags embedded in a doubled-over section of the tether. When a tether is stressed to the point of overload, the colored flag is exposed, indicating it's time to buy a new tether. (To review the ISAF regulations on tethers, check out www.sailing.org and select Offshore Special Regulations.) The tethers' snap shackles also appear to have been changed. The metal on the shackle is shinier, and the head opening is smaller.
