

## Staying safe without spending a small fortune

Practical Sallor began the year with a look at results from the 2005 Crew Overboard Retrieval Symposium, a founday event on San Francisco Bay, which involved 115 people in 15 boats. Results from that test revealed the West Marine Lifesling 2 (\$100, www.westmarine.com) as the most usefuland. That event prompted our own test of throw bags (May 2006), which rated the West Marine Deluxe throwbag (\$66) best.

We also conducted two lifejacket tests: one for youths weighing from 50 to 90 pounds, and a second that tested life vests for infants (under 30 pounds) and toddlers (30-50 pounds). Among the lifejackets for youths, only two really stood out in terms of comfort, fit, and buoyancy. The Steams 3630 (550, eangler.com) and the Mustang MV3160's (\$60, www. westmarine.com) earned our top picks. The Stearns was theonly one with reflective tape, while the Mustang featured a lifting strap at the collar. Among the infant and toddler PFDs, the MTI Bay Bee 201 (\$35, www.mthadventurewear.com) was a clear favorite. It featured an overstzed YKK zipper, secure lifting straps, and a comfortable collar.
