## **CRITIC'S CORNER: BALBOA 26**

## **PROS**


- Hinged mast step simplifies stepping, un-stepping.
- Floats in 22 inches of water, steers in about 30 inches.
- Hull and deck construction above average for its era.
- Mid-boom mainsheet allows room for cockpit bimini top.
- Large companionway offers good ventilation below.

## CONS

- Lift-out rudder does not kick up to steer in skinny water.
- Engine location aft of rudder restricts maneuverability.
- Mid-boom sheeting and inefficient, high-friction traveler offer a workout.
- Sharp angle of aft lower shroud at mast increases load on wire and chainplate.







When under sail, the jib-sheet trimmer sits aft of the tiller, giving the helmsman a clear view ahead. But no matter the seating arrangement, leg room for four adults is tight.
