I seen no reason to rate them. I've used all of these and they all work fine.

The SPF rating determined by a very strict FDA test. I doubt any journalism-suported lab could aproach the accuracy. I read Consumer Reports procedure, and used a much smaller sample size (4 vs. 10 minimum). The very similar ingredients support that the SPF would be similar across all of these products. All are SPF 45-50 lotions. No sprays, since I don't think they make sense on a boat.
